

As part of our preventative curriculum, on Monday 6 and Wednesday 8 March, the PSNI Neighbourhood Team delivered 'One Punch Kills' sessions to our Year 8 and Year 9 classes respectively. Each class had individual sessions to provide a more intimate setting which allowed pupils to engage more freely during the question and answer time at the end. There was a very clear message about the importance of appropriate and safe behaviour and the possible serious consequences of our actions when we are upset or angry and choose physical violence to deal with situations.
